- 1. Have you completed any Culturally Responsive Pedagogy trainings or other equity related professional development? This might include coursework, MinnState System trainings, local LSC trainings, or any other equity related professional development.
- 2. Have you begun a course, assignment, materials, or syllabus redesign with equity and/or Culturally Responsive Pedagogy in mind? Make note of any of this work as specifically as possible for future reference.
- 3. Have you completed any outside reading or research on equity, particularly as related to your program, field, or to education? List any readings or research you can recall.
- 4. How do you <u>gather feedback</u> from students? How do you use feedback that has been gathered? This would include official course evaluations as well as any other surveys or check ins you have built into your courses.
- 5. Has there been any work to <u>combat racism within any standardized testing</u> that is relevant to your programs?
- 6. Have you worked to affirm student identities in the classroom?
- 7. Have you worked to help make students of color feel like they belong?
- 8. Are there any other program or discipline specific ways that your department has begun to explore improving equity?
